1. Purpose. To outline objectives and operating policy for
the Admiral Baker, Sea N' Air and Naval Station Golf Courses.

2. Facilities

a. The Admiral Baker Golf Course is located at the Admiral
Baker Navy Recreation Center near the Murphy Canyon area of San
Diego. The following facilities/services are available:

- (1) 36 holes of championship golf, North 18 (Par 72),
and South 18 (Par 72);
- (2) Driving range;
- (3) Professional golf instruction;
- (4) Practice putting greens;
- (5) Golf Shop stocked with a variety of golfing
equipment;
- (6) Golf carts, pull carts and clubs for rent;
- (7) Restaurant and cocktail lounge; and
- (8) Locker rooms with showers.

b. The Sea 'N Air Golf Course is located at Naval Base
Coronado. The following facilities/services are available:

- (1) 18 holes of championship golf;
- (2) Lighted driving range;

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- (3) Professional golf instruction;
- (4) Practice putting greens;
- (5) Golf Shop stocked with a variety of golfing equipment;
- (6) Golf carts, pull carts and clubs for rent;
- (7) Restaurant and cocktail lounge;
- (8) Locker rooms with showers;

3. Objectives. The following objectives will govern the operation of the Admiral Baker and Sea 'N Air Golf Courses:

- a. The courses are required to be self-supporting.
- b. The courses are Navy recreation facilities and will be operated in such a manner as to provide maximum benefit for the largest number of people, with every facet of operation being gauged to balance the needs of patrons, continued improvement of the physical plant and cost factors.
- c. The courses, adjoining land and facilities will be well maintained and appealing, within established budget limitations.

4. Organization. Commander, Navy Region, Southwest (CNRSW) is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the courses. In view of the extensive use of the courses by persons eligible to use Navy recreation facilities, an Advisory Committee was established by reference (a) to consider suggestions and recommendations concerning the operation and improvement of these facilities for consideration by the Regional Morale, Welfare and Recreation (MWR) Program Manager. Recommendations for major changes to the Admiral Baker and Sea 'N Air Golf Courses or supporting elements will be approved by the respective Commanding Officers of Naval Base San Diego or Naval Base Coronado.

5. Eligibility. Persons eligible to use the facilities of the course are those categories contained in reference (b), certain civilians holding honorary and courtesy membership cards and DoD civilian employees working within Navy Region, Southwest (NRSW).

- a. Honorary Membership. Honorary memberships have been issued on a permanent basis to those persons whose names appear on the Commemorative Plaque at each course.

- b. Courtesy Memberships. The privilege of using the Admiral Baker or Sea 'N Air Golf Courses may be offered by

the Commanding Officers of Naval Base San Diego and Naval Base Coronado, for their respective courses, to a few selected civilians. Approval authority may be delegated by the Commanding Officers to the MWR Site Managers at their respective bases. In this instance, the MWR Site Manager may not delegate approval authority below his/her level.

c. Minors (non-military)

(1) The privileges of the courses and driving ranges are extended to minors who are eligible as authorized dependents or as guests of eligible players, subject to the restrictions listed below. For purposes of this instruction, a minor is any non-military person younger than 21 years of age.

(2) Minors (ages seven and under) are not permitted on Admiral Baker or Sea 'N Air Golf Courses, even when accompanied by an adult. Minors (ages seven and under) may attend Sunday Junior Golf Clinics at the Naval Station Golf Course. By attending Junior Golf Clinics, minors (ages seven and under) may attain necessary knowledge to be issued a playing card by the Regional Golf Operations Manager. Once a minor has demonstrated knowledge of golf etiquette and the rules of golf, the playing card will allow the minor playing privileges while accompanied by an adult.

(3) Minors (ages eight through fifteen) are permitted use of the courses when accompanied in the group by adult members, who will be responsible for their proper conduct. Special emphasis will be placed on ensuring non-interference with adult play on the courses. Any minor (age eight through fifteen), who has adequately demonstrated a thorough knowledge of golf etiquette and the Rules of Golf as defined by the United States Golf Association (USGA), will be issued a card signed by the Regional Golf Operations Manager. This card will grant full privileges for the Admiral Baker, Sea 'N Air and Naval Station Golf Courses, without the need for accompaniment by an adult. The Regional Golf Operations Manager may withdraw privileges and the playing card for violation of etiquette or USGA rules.

(4) Immediate family minors (sixteen years of age or older) are afforded the full privileges of the courses.

d. Other authorized participants include:

(1) Active duty personnel of other activities and their dependents.

(2) Naval reservists on active duty for training (in excess of 72 hours) and their dependents.

(3) Members of reserve components during periods of inactive duty.

(4) Foreign nations' military personnel and their immediate family, when authorized full Navy Exchange privileges in conjunction with official orders to visit or serve in the United States.

e. Provided facilities are adequate and subject to such restrictions as the Regional MWR Program Manager and Commanding Officers of Naval Base San Diego and Naval Base Coronado deem necessary, the following are also authorized to obtain starting times:

(1) Fleet Reserve and retired personnel and immediate family members of retired personnel.

(2) Eligible children and un-remarried widows of deceased military personnel.

(3) Naval reservists in a drill pay status.

(4) Retired DoD and MWR (NAF) civilian employees

(5) DoD civilian employees working for a NRSW command.

(6) Retired DoD and MWR (NAF) civilian employees.

(7) Foreign nations' military personnel with orders serving in the United States.

(8) Members of the Public Health Services, Environmental Science Services Administration, uniformed paid members of the Red Cross and other such organizations, when assigned to and serving with the armed forces.

(9) Civilian employees of the DoD, when quartered aboard the station and authorized exchange privileges.

f. Guests. Personnel eligible to use the course may be accompanied in the same group by occasional guests. At no time are guests to interfere with, or prohibit active duty personnel from using the golf course. Tournaments held in compliance with enclosure (1) are the exception to the guest policy.

g. Precedence. Play will be regulated on a reservation basis, and through the use of starter times (with priorities listed in paragraph 9). Players will register in the Golf Shop before commencing play. Each player is required to hand the Starter his/her receipt prior to playing. Individuals who attempt to "tee off" without payment of green fees will lose playing privileges immediately and further disciplinary action may result. The Regional Golf Operations Manager and his/her

staff will have full authority to act as Starters and to patrol the courses.

6. Hours of operation. Courses will normally be open for play seven days a week during the entire year. The Courses and Golf Shops will be open from sunrise to sunset on weekdays, weekends and holidays. The driving ranges will open at sunrise and close at a time designated by the Regional MWR Program Manager.

7. Reservations. Tee time procedures for the Admiral Baker and Sea 'N Air Golf Courses are as follows:

a. Weekend Procedures

(1) Tee times will be reserved on a first-come, first-served basis. Active duty personnel may begin calling to obtain a tee time at 0600 on the preceding Tuesday. Retired personnel may obtain tee times beginning at 1000 on the preceding Tuesday.

(2) In order to give all authorized personnel an opportunity to obtain a desirable tee time, each weekend and holiday will have every fourth tee time held (not released) until 1000 the preceding Tuesday.

(3) Civilian DoD, retired DoD and MWR personnel are authorized to reserve tee times beginning on the preceding Thursday at 0600 for weekends and holidays.

b. Weekday Procedures. Weekday tee times can be made seven days in advance starting at 0600 for active duty and retired personnel. Civilian DoD, retired DoD and MWR personnel can call five days in advance for times.

c. Tee Time Policies

(1) A minimum of two players is required to reserve a tee time.

(2) Singles and groups without tee times will be placed on a standby list after arriving at the course and checking in with the starter.

(3) Tee times are set at seven-minute intervals.

(4) A Starter time will be used every hour. These times will be kept open to make up time if running behind.

(5) Fivesomes are authorized when pre-booked. On Friday, Saturday, Sunday and holidays, all golfers in the fivesome are required to take riding carts.

(6) Fleet times or Starter times will be reserved for forces afloat who are unable to use established procedures because of underway schedules. Fleet starting times will be

assigned on a first-come, first-served basis by contacting the Golf Shops prior to 1600, Friday, of the desired weekend or by submitting the request in the ship's Logistics Request (LOGREQ). These fleet starting times are provided only for ships underway prior to, or during the normal reservation period. If requests for these times are not received prior to 1600 on Friday, they will be made available for use by persons on the waiting list controlled by the Starter.

(7) To assure availability of Advisory Committee Members on the course to carry out their responsibilities, members may obtain starting time reservations beginning at 0900 on Friday until 0900 on Monday, for the following week. Board members must confirm their tee times by 1000 each Thursday. Tee times not confirmed will be used to fill reservation requests.

(8) Commanding Officers of Naval Base San Diego and Naval Base Coronado may assign tee times for their respective courses to accommodate protocol requirements.

8. Tournaments

a. As a general statement of policy, tournaments must be scheduled during slow times, generally after noon, during the week. Tournaments other than the Admiral Baker Golf Course Invitational, Men's Club Member Guest Tournaments, and the Admiral Baker Golf Course Championships to be played on the North Course, (See enclosure (1) for tournament fees and requirements.)

b. Several Shotgun Tournaments will be allowed during the calendar year. These include:

Navy Golf Course Invitational
Men's Club Member Guest
Men's Club Championship
Men's Club Super Scramble
Ladies' Club Championship
Ladies' Membership Guest Tournament
Ladies' Club Christmas Tournament

Sea 'N Air Golf Course

Men's Club SNA Electic
Men's Club Member Guest
Men's Club Championship
Ladies' Club Monthly Shotgun
Ladies' Club Member Guest
Ladies' Club Championship

Other Shotgun tournaments will be allowed on a case-by-case basis, with the approval of golf course management. All players participating in shotgun tournaments are required to use riding carts.

Note: Golf Shop staff will have absolute control of starting times, especially concerning priorities for accommodating the waiting list (using priorities stated in paragraph 7g, above). Starter times will be used at all times, including tournaments (except active duty and Shotgun Tournaments), for active duty personnel. If more than one group requests the same time and date for a tournament, the active duty group will have priority.

c. Policies and Procedures Governing Shotgun Tournaments

(1) Shotgun Tournaments will start no later than 0800 to allow the course to be reopened at 1300 for regular play. Exceptions to this rule may be made by the Regional Golf Operations Manager.

(2) A Shotgun Tournament is comprised of not less than 144 players and the golf course will be reserved for those players participating in the tournament. Full tournament green fees will be charged for each player (punch cards will not be honored). In the event less than 144 players participate in the tournament, full green fees for 144 players will still be required. The total payment with a list of names of players and their status, military or guest, will be furnished to the Golf Shop prior to commencement of play. If it is determined in advance that less than 144 players will participate in the tournament and the golf course is notified ten days prior to scheduled date, the tournament may be changed to a "modified" Shotgun Tournament (minimum of 72 players) as follows:

(a) Green fees will be charged for 144 or 72 players if less actually participate. If more than 144 or 72 players participate, fees will be based on actual numbers.

(b) Punch cards will not be honored.

(c) Starting times for "modified" tournaments will be no later than 0800 or 1330 hours on the scheduled date.

(3) Golf carts are required for all tournaments.

d. The minimum requirement for tournaments may be waived on a case-by-case basis for active duty commands.

e. Enclosure (1), Tournament Fee Agreement, contains additional tournament requirements.

9. Fees. Green fees, rental fees, and other such charges will be established to ensure that the course operates without a deficit.

10. Clothing. Clothing worn on the courses will be in good taste. Men will be in appropriate apparel, which includes shirts and trousers or shorts. Swimming attire will not be permitted on the courses, driving range or in the clubhouse area. High-heeled shoes, baseball shoes, or football shoes are not permitted on the courses. Golf shoes, flat-heeled shoes or rubber-soled shoes are acceptable. The following dress will be prohibited:

- a. Bare feet.
- b. Tank tops or cut off half-shirts.
- c. White undershirts (T-shirts with pocket(s) are acceptable).
- d. Cut-offs (trousers or shorts).
- e. Shower sandals (unless medically necessary).
- f. Excessively bare midriffs.
- g. Mini or loose-fitting halter-tops.
- h. Hair curlers (covered or not).
- i. Excessively revealing short pants.
- j. Clothing which is excessively worn, frayed, soiled or dirty.
- k. Items of clothing such as footwear, headwear, and accoutrements, which are sexually or racially provocative, vulgar, or defiling to the United States or any other country.
- l. No metal spikes. Golf courses are soft spike facilities.

11. Customs, Courtesies and Rules

a. Personnel using the course are expected to observe rules, courtesies and established customs. Except as modified by local rules printed on the scorecards or posted in the Golf Shops, USGA rules will apply. Players can enjoy the courses to the greatest extent if each player will make it a point to smooth traps by raking, replace divots and repair ball marks that are found on the greens. Two golfers may not share one set of clubs. Each golfer playing a round of golf must have in his/her possession a separate or partial set of golf clubs. Cooperation in caring for the course is expected from all players. Practicing on the course is prohibited.

b. Individual members of the Advisory Committee must acquaint themselves thoroughly with the USGA Rules of Golf and the local rules (copies of each to be provided to members by the Golf Course Management). When playing golf, members should have affixed prominently to their bag an identifying "Advisory Committee" tag (provided by the Course Management), which will give them the authority to adjudicate (upon request of a player(s)) any question concerning the rules under which the course is played (USGA, as amended by the local rules).

c. The Advisory Committee members and the Regional Golf Operations Manager and his staff, as well as the Marshals, are responsible for cautioning players who are violating the rules of play, causing physical damage to the course, disregarding rules of etiquette, dropping trash or litter on the course instead of using available trash cans, or misusing the riding carts in any manner. If players ignore proper warning, they will be requested to stop playing and leave the course. A full report will be made to the Chairman of the Advisory Committee as soon as possible.

d. Fishing is not permitted at the Admiral Baker recreation area or Sea 'N Air Golf Course. This includes the picnic area, all lakes and waters bordering the perimeter of the picnic area and the golf course.

e. To eliminate slow play, enforce the rules of golf and assist in emergencies, Golf Course Marshals are assigned to patrol the golf courses. Marshals are assigned to act on behalf of golf course management and golfers must obey requests made by the Marshals. Failure of a golfer to obey a Marshal's request could result in immediate removal from the golf course and temporary or permanent loss of playing privileges. Marshal duties and course regulations are listed in enclosure (2). Prior to issuing a letter to advise a patron of loss of golf course privileges, the Commanding Officers of Naval Base San Diego and Naval Base Coronado or Regional MWR Program Manager, as appropriate, may, at their discretion, request that the Advisory Committee review the circumstances of the case and make a recommendation as to what action should be taken.

f. Golfers with non-playing guests must receive permission from the Regional Golf Operations Manager or his/her designated representative prior to admitting the guests to the courses. Additionally, if using a riding cart, golfers must pay the cart fee for their non-playing guests. During busy times and days such as weekend mornings or holidays, non-playing guests may be denied access to the golf courses.

RETURN OF CONTRACT & DEPOSIT: If the above information meets your approval, please sign and return the two (2) top copies of the contract along with a _____% deposit of \$_____ to hold your date(s). In order to receive a refund of the deposit, written notification must be received at least 10 days prior to the date of your tournament.

FINAL CONFIRMATION: No later than 10 days prior to your tournament date, you are required to quote an exact number of golfers. All fees and charges in effect on tournament date must be paid in full, or your tee times will be cancelled with no refund. Your final confirmation date is: _____

OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES: 1. Refunds (other than 10-day cancellation) will not be made. 2. Any damage to the golf course, cart fleet and/or property due to misconduct by participants of your event must be paid by your tournament committee. 3. Any food or beverage consumed by the group must be provided by MWR Food and Beverage Division. 4. Tournament participants must observe all prevailing rules and regulations covering the course. 5. Host course reserves the right to fill incomplete starting times within the tournament group from the Daily Call Sheet. 6. Golf carts are mandatory for all players in shotgun and non military tournaments. 7. To ensure golf cart availability, please arrange to have pairing sheets to the head golf professional at least 48 hours in advance of tournament. Groups are scheduled every _____ minutes. 8. A military tournament requires 51% of participants to be eligible military or retired parties. 9. A minimum of 40 players is required to pre-book non-military tournament tee times. A minimum of 32 players is required to pre-book military/retired military tournament. A minimum of 144 players is required to hold a Shotgun Tournament. Any change to this policy must be approved by the golf director. 10. Punchcards may not be used for any tournament. 11. All golf merchandise awards presented must be purchased through CNRSW Golf Pro Shop. 12. If additional riding carts, in excess of current fleet, are required to hold the tournament, the command/organization agrees to pay the charges required to obtain these carts.

It is the responsibility of persons organizing a golf tournament at Commander Navy Region Southwest golf courses to be familiar with, and guarantee enforcement of, the following rules and regulations: 1. Ensure players are aware that slow play will not be tolerated and the Course Marshal has authority to request slow playing groups to pick up their golf balls and go to the next tee. 2. Riding carts must be kept at least 30 feet away from greens and tees. The 90-degree rule is in effect for riding carts. Each player must have a set of clubs. Only two riders and two golf bags are permitted on each riding cart. 3. The dress code will be strictly enforced at all times. Shirts must be worn at all times. Bare feet are not permitted. Dress code requirements are posted at the Golf Pro Shop for your information. 4. All cans and trash must be put in trash receptacles, not left on the golf course. Players are to replace their divots and ball marks should be repaired on the greens. 5. In accordance with BUPERSINST 1710.11 the base MWR Department is the only authorized agent to enter into commercial sponsorship agreements with outside organizations or businesses for tournament prizes or funding. No commercial signage or representation will be allowed at CNRSW Golf Course unless arranged by MWR Department. 6. Commercial vendors, sponsor signs, flyers and banners, caterers, concessionaires and/or suppliers are not permitted. The MWR Department can arrange for catered service, if desired. All entertainment must be booked through the MWR Department (556-7029). 7. Outside agency personnel/companies/vendors' sponsors are not permitted to advertise or conduct workshops, demonstrations, classes or instructions of any kind. By signing this contract, I agree to all stipulations listed above and further agree to be financially responsible for any loss and/or damage to CNRSW Golf Course arising from misconduct or negligence of any individual participants in this tournament.

ADMIRAL BAKER/SEA 'N AIR GOLF COURSE MARSHAL'S
DUTIES AND COURSE REGULATIONS

The primary duty of the Golf Course Marshal is to prevent slow play. Slow play is defined as having one or more holes open between two groups of players.

- First Warning: Marshal will give players an opportunity to catch up with the group ahead.
- Second Warning: Marshal has option to either ask the group to stand aside and allow the group behind to play through, or ask the group to pick up and move to the next hole.
- Third Warning: Marshal will ask the group to leave the golf course. If the group does not cooperate, security personnel will be contacted to remove offending players from the course. Written report will be submitted to the MWR Program Manager and a letter(s) advising of loss of golf privileges may be issued by the appropriate Commanding Officer.

Golf Cart Regulations:

1. Do not drive carts on or near greens or in posted areas.
2. Minors under the age of 16 may not drive carts.
3. No more than two bags on a cart.
4. No more than two riders in a cart.
5. Riding carts must use 90 degree rule.
6. Do not pull handcarts on or adjacent to tees or greens.

Other Regulations:

1. No practicing on fairways and greens.
2. Each player must have one set of clubs and bag.
3. Observe proper dress code.
4. Prior to teeing off, each player must register at the golf shops.
5. Replace divots and repair ball marks. Anyone found to be in violation of any of the above regulations may be asked to leave the golf course by the Golf Course Marshal. Failure on the part of anyone to obey the actions requested by the Golf Course Marshal may result in a barring order being issued by the Commanding Officer or Regional MWR Program Manager.

ORGANIZATION, OBJECTIVES AND RULES
FOR NAVAL STATION GOLF COURSE

1. Facilities. The Naval Station Golf Course is located on 32nd Street, just east of Harbor Drive and adjacent to the The Olde Gym, Bldg. 223. The following services are available:

- a. Lighted nine holes (Par 27) golf course.
- b. Lighted driving range.
- c. Professional golf instruction.
- d. Practice putting green and chipping green with sand trap.
- e. Rental pull carts and golf clubs.
- f. Golf shop stocked with a variety of golf equipment and apparel.

2. Objectives. The following objectives will govern operation of the Naval Station Golf Course.

- a. The course is expected to be self-supporting.
- b. The course is a Navy recreation facility and will be operated in such a manner as to provide the most good for the most people, with every facet of operation being gauged to a balance of the needs of the patrons, continued improvement of the physical plant and cost factors.
- c. The course will be well maintained and appealing within the established budget.

3. Organization. The Regional MWR Program Manager is responsible for the administration, operation and maintenance of the facility.

4. Eligibility

- a. Persons eligible to use the course facilities are contained in reference (a).
- b. The privileges of the course are extended to minors who are eligible as authorized dependents, or as guests of eligible players, subject to the restrictions listed below. For purposes of this instruction, a minor is any non-military person younger than 21 years of age.
- c. Minors, up to age fifteen, are permitted use of the course when accompanied in the same foursome (threesome or twosome) by an eligible adult member who will be responsible for

their proper conduct. Special emphasis shall be placed on ensuring non-interference with adult play on the course.

d. Any minor, ages eight through fifteen, who qualifies through the Military Junior Golf Program and adequately demonstrates a thorough knowledge of golf etiquette and the Rules of Golf as defined by the USGA, will be issued a card signed by the Regional Golf Operations Manager. This card will grant full privileges for Naval Station, Admiral Baker and Sea 'N Air Golf Courses without the need for accompaniment by an adult. The Regional Golf Operations Manager may withdraw privileges and the playing card for violation of etiquette or USGA rules.

e. Military personnel eligible to use the course may be accompanied in the same foursome by occasional guests.

f. Dependent minors, sixteen years of age are afforded full privileges of the Naval Station Golf Course.

g. All play will be regulated on a first-come, first-serve basis. The exceptions being that active duty military personnel have priority on the tee from 1100-1300 on weekdays, less holidays.

6. Hours of Operation. The course will normally open for play seven days per week in accordance with the posted hours of operation.

7. Fees. Green fees, rental fees and other such charges will be established to ensure the golf course operates without a deficit.

8. Clothing. Clothing worn on the course will be in good taste. Men will be in appropriate apparel, which includes shirts and trousers or shorts. Men in uniform may remove their shirt when playing, provided a regulation undershirt is worn. Immodest or brief attire will not be permitted on the course, driving range or in the vicinity of the Golf Shop. High heeled shoes, baseball shoes or football shoes are not permitted on the golf course or driving range. Golf shoes, flat heeled shoes or rubber soled shoes are acceptable.

9. Customs, Courtesies and Rules. All persons utilizing the course are expected to observe the rules, courtesies and established customs, and, expect as modified by local rules printed on the scorecards or posted in the Golf Shop, U.S. Golf Associated rules will apply. All players will enjoy the course to the greatest extent if each player will make it a point to replace divots and repair ball marks that are found on the fairways and greens. Each golfer playing a round of golf must have in his/her possession a separate set or partial set of golf clubs. Clubs may not be shared. Cooperation in caring for the

course is expected of all players. Practicing on the course is prohibited.

10. Rules. The Regional Golf Operations Manager and his staff will have the authority to adjudicate, upon request of a player(s), any question concerning the rules under which the course is played (USGA, as amended by the local rules). Management will have the additional responsibility for cautioning players who are violating the rules of play, causing physical damage to the course, disregarding rules of etiquette or dropping trash or litter on the course, instead of using the trash cans provided at convenient locations. If players ignore proper warning, they will be requested to stop play and leave the course. A full report will be made to the Commanding Officer and/or Regional MWR Program Manager as soon as possible.
